2021 Development

As a school heavily oversubscribed and rapidly improving, we have been awarded £2.5 million to expand the school. At the time of writing this we are commissioning the following:

Renovation of x4 science rooms in to fit for purpose wet labs.

Creation of an additional food tech classroom. This will facilitate our vision that all students willlearn to cook in every year group, every year. This is a compulsory part of our curriculum.

An additional staircase installed to ensure the smooth movement of students around the Academy.

I am currently working with our architects, designing an additional sports block. This will provide:

Additional sports changing rooms for the students for community use.

Additional classrooms for the Health faculty.

Glass frontage to view sport on the 3G pitch.

A link bridge to the main school building.







Our Facilities

Arts Award

At Essa Academy we offer the Bronze Arts Award to all Year 9 students through the disciplines of Art, Graphics, Photography, Music, Drama and Dance. Arts Award inspires young people to grow their arts and leadership talents: it's creative, valuable and accessible. Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF).

To achieve a Bronze Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log or portfolio of their experiences of:

· Actively participating in any art form

- At least one arts event and their review of that event
- Researching the career and work of an artist or crafts-person
- · Passing on an arts skill

Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 also have the opportunity to take part in the Silver Award as an extra-curricular course which is an RQF Level 2 qualification.

Cadets

The Combined Cadet Force offers students at Essa Academy a course designed to support the development of personal responsibility, leadership and self-discipline. Designed to be practical rather than classroom-based, the training will be interesting, imaginative and purposeful and include competitions, exercises and games. Students take part in a broad range of challenging, exciting, adventurous and educational activities over the three year Cadets syllabus called the Army Proficiency

Certificate (APC). Alongside this, students have the opportunity to take part in annual Cadets Camps and other community events through the Combined Cadets Force.



Unique Selling Points in our Curriculum

Essa Experience Day, paid for by the Academy for all students, is a key part of our offer. Students get to visit museums, theatres, stadiums and the countryside and many other places linked to specific subjects three times a year (15 visits minimum). They also get to see universities, raising aspirations and opening their eyes to the opportunities around them (see intent map).

Within the curriculum we have built in leadership courses for all students from year 9 upwards, these include **Young Leaders, Cadets, Sports Leaders** and **the Duke of Edinburgh**. Every student will have something that gives them the 'edge' when they go out into the world of employment and understand what good leadership looks like.



The Arts is a compulsory part of the curriculum offer; In a time where The Arts is being side-lined in many school's at Essa Academy we strongly believe that children should have access to a wide range of subjects in the arts, we want all students to have time to express themselves and find their talents and love for the Arts. We offer Music, Drama, Fine Art, Photography and Graphics. All Students also work towards completing the Arts mark qualification which gives them exposure to The Arts through various projects, shows and trips.

Food technology is compulsory throughout all 5 years at Essa Academy, we have facilities that are second to none and we see this as a key skill for every young person to have when they leave us. Dietary advice, basic cooking skills, budgeting, planning and being independent are all instilled in our students in these lessons.

PE is compulsory for all, we wish to support the advice from the department of health and social care that 5-18 year olds need to be doing at least 60 minutes a day of exercise, whilst we could not feasibly provide this level of PE, we have put as much as we can in the curriculum to support this. We provide wide range of sports through the curriculum and extra-curricular; these are available to students so that they can find their exercise of choice. The facilities allow us to deliver a high quality offer in this area.

PSHE is compulsory for every year group. Students cover a range of topics including, positive relationships with peers, family and the wider world including exploring the ideas of finance, drugs and alcohol, mental health, the law, citizenship, online safety and prejudice and discrimination. All aspects of PSHEE link back to the relationships students have with the people they will encounter everyday. PSHEE ensures that students are well-rounded individuals who are able to integrate into society with knowledge and understanding of the wider world.

We have a range of activities that take place throughout each year group that meet the needs of the **Gatsby Benchmarks**. These include professional interview day, student development day, careers fairs, work experience college and university visits. **Careers** sessions are compulsory throughout the 5 years. In these sessions we cover making choices, labour market information, stereotypes in careers, enterprising skills, rights and responsibilities and workplace law. We also support students with C.V.'s personal statements and college applications. This allows our students to fully informed when considering future careers, linking it to the local labour markets and even consider those careers that do not exist yet but will.



Our Curriculum Impact

Our students WILL be valuable citizens of society, community and country.

Local Context:

We aim to support our students in becoming well rounded citizens of their society, community and country. We have designed the curriculum to combat barriers that are presented to our students in the local community but also ensure our students are well suited to the opportunities that are available to them in the North West region in the coming years.

Bolton also has lots of opportunities; it is a gateway town which is growing as a rich mix of cultures and communities. Bolton is in need of a larger labour force, the types of employment in the area are shifting with Media and the arts growing alongside social care and businesses. There has been a £1.1billion injection of funding to improve Bolton town centre, there is a bright future ahead for our students as they enter their local community. Our students have been exposed to a wide range of subjects and careers advice which will support them in finding their place and role in this growing community.



It is imperative that our students leave school being able to make healthy lifestyle choices. Our curriculum has considered this carefully and by providing physical education, PSHEE, food technology throughout their time at school our students will be able to make better life choices which will have a positive impact on their health and ultimately the communities in which they live.

Mental health is equally as important to us as physical health and it is crucial our students find strategies to cope with stress and mental health problems. In the UK 20% of adolescents may experience a mental health problem (in any given year). These statistics have supported our careful planning of mental health in the curriculum and the support around it. We have a full time counsellor on site to support our students alongside PSHEE lessons with strong mental health and well-being messages threading through them.





Young Leaders

The Young Leaders Award, part of the Archbishop of York Youth Trust, is a unique active citizenship programme which empowers young people to make a difference in their local community whilst growing in key leadership skills. The Award focuses specifically on developing students' leadership and character skills in preparation for life after school. Students explore how they can 'be the change they want to see' in their communities and practically make a difference through social action and volunteering.

Young Leaders Award is designed to:

- Build leadership and character skills
- Grow confidence, teamwork, resilience and care for others
- Empower students to serve their communities through volunteering

Sports Leadership

The Sports Leadership programme is designed to develop confident, healthy leaders through sport and physical activity. Performing Arts



Welcome to Performing Arts here at Essa Academy. The subjects included within Performing Arts are Music and Drama. Performing Arts is part of a large faculty called 'The Arts Faculty'. All arts subjects are compulsory subjects and as such you will study every Arts subject at KS3. At KS4 you will have the opportunity to specialise and choose your favourite or your best 'Arts' subject and study towards a GCSE qualification that may lead to a career in the Arts or will compliment another career pathway.

All 'Arts' subjects are fun and interesting and you will learn lots of new knowledge and exciting skills that will enrich your life. You will learn to act, sing, dance, perform, draw, paint, sculpt, play an instrument just to name a few.



Music

Music at Essa is at the heart of the school and is an amazing subject to learn. Every student will learn how to read music notation, understand how music is made/composed and have the chance to play a multitude of instruments. There are music clubs every single day where students from all year groups get the chance to use the music facility and practice their instrument. We have drum club, guitar club, piano keyboard club, choir/vocal group, steel pans club, advanced drumming club. Musicians have the opportunity to perform all the time, with the performance being in the classroom or on the bigger stages around the school. You get to choose!

All students have access to individual or small group instrumental lessons. These lessons are free to students as the school pays for specialist tutors to come and assist the school music teachers. If you already play and instrument then you can continue to excel. If you have always wanted to play a musical instrument then now is your time! We have opportunities in brass (trumpets etc), strings (violins etc), piano, guitar, vocal and drums/percussion.

We hold regular concerts from professional musicians who come into our school and perform for us to inspire all our young musicians.

Drama

At the Academy we have a fantastic drama theatre and very dedicated and talented drama staff who will guide you on your learning journey in Drama.

We have two school show performances every year where students can audition and secure a role either on-stage or in a technical position. The theatre has fantastic sound and light systems and students will learn how to operate these and excel in this vital area. Drama is a fantastic subject in boosting confidence and expression.

Our Head Teacher always says that any career involves some sort of performance and presentation. Drama is the subject that can improve a students' confidence in public speaking and performance. We have monologue competitions, set design roles and all the Arts subjects work closely together in providing a rewarding and enriching Arts experience for our students.

We have an exciting enrichment subject starting this year called 'musical theatre' where students will learn all about every elements of a theatre career including sound and light design, costuming, clowning and magic!



Extra Curricular

Essa Academy offers a wealth of clubs and activities for students to attend during social times, before and after school. This programme is part of our broad, balanced and exciting curriculum and allows our students to demonstrate spirit, trying out new activities and taking part in school-wide events.

Essa Academy has been a Foundation partner school since February 2018.

The Foundation works alongside staff at Essa Academy to:

- Engage Year 9 boys on a programme of half-day physical activity per week through Foundation delivery programmes
- Mentor hard to reach Year 10 students on a programme of a half-day of activity per week around leadership and through Foundation delivery programmes
- Provide girls-only sports sessions with a longterm goal of signposting players towards school teams and clubs within the local community
- Deliver structured football sessions with a longterm goal of improving sporting performance and signposting players towards football clubs within the local community
- Provide additional activities such as holiday clubs for four weeks of the academic year
- Support with activities such as after school clubs each term
- Identify and support disengaged male students through Manchester United Foundation leadership and mentoring programmes
- Collaborate on the development and delivery of a literacy programme with the aim of improving student reading levels
- Deliver educational and sporting activities to primary schools within the local community

Careers

At Essa Academy we believe that all students should be exposed to as many opportunities as possible involving careers and the world of work.

Our Careers Advisor, Miss Milburn, offers careers advice and guidance every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday before school, at lunchtime and after school in the Library.

Year 10 and 11 students are given designated slots with Miss Milburn to discuss their flight path, and options for further and higher education.

At Essa Academy we believe that high quality careers advice, guidance and support are key in preparing students for their next steps in life and to manage those vital stepping stones from learning, training and into the world of work.

We aim to provide students with the skills and knowledge they need to make informed and aspirational choices. As such, our programme begins with Year 7 students considering the world of work and the range of career sectors available to them; it ends in Year 11 with guidance and support to help students make the next appropriate steps, whether that is sixth form, FE college or apprenticeship.

Year 7 Induction

The Essa Foundation Academies Trust is the admissions authority for Essa Academy: Bolton MBC coordinates admission applications on behalf of the Trust.

In brief EFAT's admissions policy for Essa Academy and over-subscription criteria are:

- All children will be admitted if there are sufficient places available.
- Children with a statement of special educational need or an Educational Health Care plan, naming Essa Academy will be admitted.
- If there are insufficient places available, priority will be given to:
- Looked after children (children in public care), or those who have been
- Other children deemed vulnerable
- Children with a sibling attending Essa Primary Academy or Essa Academy
- Children with a proven medical or social need
- Children who live nearest to Essa Academy
- Tie breaker geographical proximity to Essa Academy

Arrangements, and the timetable, for normal time admission to Essa Academy i.e. admissions to Year 7 in September 2020 are:

By September 2020

Bolton MBC publishes a composite prospectus of all state funded school places in Bolton.

By 31st October 2020

Closing date for return of paper and online applications.

By 1st January 2021

Bolton MBC publishes arrangements for coordinating all admissions in Bolton.

On 1st March 2021 (or next working day)
Offers of places will by email or post sent out to parents/carers.

End of March 2021

Last date for appeals to be lodged, which will be held in the first round of appeals. Appeals lodged after this date may be heard later in June/July.

March - Autumn 2021

Children who have not been offered a place at their chosen school will automatically be added to the schools waiting list.

End of April/May/June 2021

School appeals heard.

At Essa Academy we are celebrating our best ever results, with a record-breaking number of students achieving top grades in their 2019 GCSE examinations.

Despite the more challenging examinations and increased grade boundaries in many subjects, the Academy has seen a 6% increase in the number of students achieving grades 4-9 in both English and Maths, and a 4% increase in grades 5-9.



A total of 223 grades were in the topgrade bracket of 7-9, including 23 grade 9s, the highest level possible, and 69 grade 8s.

These record-breaking results are made even more significant as our class of 2019 entered the Academy

in Year 7 with an average Key Stage 2 attainment grade significantly below the national average, meaning that students have made outstanding progress in their years of education at Essa Academy.
